Council Capsule October-November 2020

- Revenues for the month ending 10/31/20 were \$7,866.12 with expenses of \$8,314.43 and a net of (\$448.31). Revenues for the year are \$99,688.79 and expenses for the year are \$100,948.49 with a net for the year of (\$1,259.70). It should be noted that this deficit in current net does **not** reflect the on-going revenues or expenses for the parsonage renovation. As of 10/31/20 the parsonage renovation has expended \$39,270.76 with a final payment to the contractor still outstanding.
- Sunday, December 27, 2020 worship service will be on-line only. No in-person service will be available.
- The date of the Annual Congregational Meeting is Sunday, January 24, 2021 with a "snow date" of Sunday, February 14, 2021.
- All committee and organizational reports are due in church office by January 10, 2021.
- There will be 3 open Council positions due to term limits at the Annual Congregation Meeting: Vice President, Secretary, and Resource Management. Also, 4 positions are up for re-election. Please consider where you might serve.
- Pr. Chris will be seeking bids for a new integrated audio system for the church.
- The next Council meeting will be after worship service on Sunday, December 13, 2020.

Christmas Celebration

Please read all of what comes next: Because planning and production take time, because we don't want to slap something together, and because we don't see things getting any better (probably worse, unfortunately), Thom and Keith and I have decided that we will record the main portion of the Christmas Eve celebration in advance. Because we'll have more time to produce it, it will post to YouTube and Facebook sound-balanced so you won't have to worry about the terrible sound our livestream music makes. Also, this will allow us to make CDs or DVDs for anyone who doesn't have internet access.

Because part of the evening's plans included singing together outside around a fire (because Thom and Keith are both awesome and creative), we plan to offer more opportunities to do so. At 5pm, 6pm, and 7pm, we invite anyone who is interested to sing about 4 of Thom and Keith's favorite Christmas carols together around fires that they set up in our alleyway (we have long since received permission from the town, and the alley will be blocked to traffic). There will be a brass trio.

We are very sad that the main part of the evening will not be live, but we hope that you will join us for some Christmas cheer and celebrating Jesus' birth in song together around a fire outside of Messiah at 5pm, 6pm, or 7pm on Christmas Eve.

Dear Members of Messiah Lutheran Church,

I believe that there is on earth a holy little flock and community of pure saints under one head, Christ. ... Luther's explanation of the Third Article of the Creed.

It's been a rough year, hasn't it?

As the bishop said "I used to know of people who have COVID-19; now I know people who have COVID-19. I don't know to be a person who has COVID-19."

Whereas it was "over there" back in March, now, it's here.

So, council voted electronically on Monday, and the vote was unanimous – we're moving worship to online only for at least the next three weeks.

I know that some of you will be very disappointed or upset. I've received your admonitions, many of which were variations of "we should return to normal!"

Still, I believe that we are acting in the best interest of the congregation.

At our meeting on 8 November, council voted to get quotes on updating the sound system so that the music sounds better. The "Geek Squad" representative will be on Tuesday, November 24th. In the meantime, I'm going to try one or two more things to try to improve sound quality.

I will again expand the mailing list to include those people who do not have internet access. If you would like to take home a hymnal until the pandemic is over, you are certainly welcome.

Back in March, we said that this won't last forever; I still think that's accurate, and while Easter was messed up, and Christmas might be as well, I live in hope that we'll return to something much more like normal some time next year.

We might be in for a rough winter. But regardless of what else happens, I still believe that Jesus Christ is the light that shines in the darkness. I still trust in Christ's promise to be with us always, even to the end of the age. I still believe that the Church, as Luther understood it, is not the building but is formed by the Holy Spirit in knowing God's Word, which we will continue to do.
